STATEMENT ON THE MISSION OF THE CHURCH & Elder Jeff Black

Moderator: The mission of God in Christ gives shape and substance to the life and work of the Church. In Christ, the Church participates in God's mission for the transformation of creation and humanity by proclaiming to all people the good news of God's love, offering to all people the grace of God at font and table, and

calling all people to discipleship in Christ. Human beings have no higher goal in life than to glorify and enjoy God now and forever, living in covenant fellowship with God and participating in God's mission. Today we reclaim our historic calling and remember the great ends of the church:

Unison: The proclamation of the gospel for the salvation of humankind; the shelter, nurture, and spiritual fellowship of the children of God; the maintenance of divine worship; the preservation of the truth; the promotion of social righteousness; and the exhibition of the Kingdom of Heaven to the world.

Moderator:

subject to the ordering of God's Word and Spirit?

Candidate: I will.

neighbors, and work for the reconciliation of the world?

Candidate: I will.

Moderator: Do you promise to further the peace, unity, and purity of the church?

Moderator: Will you pray for and seek to serve the people with energy, intelligence,

imagination, and love?

Moderator: Will you be a faithful teaching elder, proclaiming the good news in Word and

Sacrament, teaching faith and caring for people? Will you be active in government and discipline, serving in the councils of the church; and in your

ministry will you try to show the love and justice of Jesus Christ?
