ANNOUNCEMENTS:

The Session and the Deacon's & Trustee presidents have moved us back to virtual-only services and meetings Until January 3rd. We will be evaluating where we stand with regard to the COVID pandemic. We have at least 4 and possibly 5 or more cases within the congregation in the past three weeks. When taken in tandem with the current super-spike in cases, we do this out of an abundance of caution and for the good of the body.

While not being overly-dependent upon the Governor's new restrictions on public meetings, we are aware that every county in Western PA has been reporting case numbers in the hundreds for several weeks now, and Allegheny County has been reporting upwards of 1,000 per day.
