Brothers & Sisters,

As we reflect this Lenten season upon Christ's road to Calvary and our redemption, we should give particular thought to the great weight and burden of pain, despair, isolation and evil that he bore on our account.

My own reflections on these themes this year are very much shaped by the circumstances occurring around me. As I write this, we are one year into the COVID-19 Pandemic, we face domestic political turmoil, economic and foreign policy chaos. In short, we're in a heck of a mess. But, in a real sense, every year is a Heck of a Mess in one way or another.

I think back to Lent 8 years ago and remember that I had just heard the news that a pastor colleague of mine suffered the loss of his wife when his mentally disturbed grandson murdered her at the breakfast table in their North Hills home. All of us in this congregation have come out of sustained seasons of transition (whether because of pastoral transition, pandemic lockdowns, job or school layoffs and closures) that, though working fairly well now, have undoubtedly left at least a few potholes to step in and yard rakes to step on so the handles hit us in the face.

But, the great news of the Cross is that the pain and isolation that Christ did bear on our account — consider that the weight of all of the sin of the world rested on His shoulders, and His alone — bore infinite fruit for those who rely on, and reside in Him. As Jesus traveled closer and closer to Jerusalem for that final visit, He knew what His disciples did not. He knew He was going there to die cruelly and as a sacrifice in which He would stand utterly and wholly alone. The rejection He bore was complete; in order for His sacrifice to be effective even the Father had to stand back from Him. This is seen in no bolder fashion than in the words of the 22nd Psalm quoted by Jesus from the Cross, "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?"

His solitary suffering has given us the ability to bear one another's burdens in love. It gives meaning to our existence in the face of meaningless and brutal evil in the world around us.

It means that when we see the horrors we can perpetrate on each other, or armed mobs fighting with police in city streets or the nations capitol, or EVEN when a young man who suffered from mental illness was driven by the deception of the devils in his head to kill his own grandmother, the sufferings caused to his family, church, community and himself are not without purpose. Though we may never understand (this side of eternity) what possible order can be salvaged or purpose served by such horrors, we may still trust that God is working out a greater purpose for our good and the good of all creation.

And though our suffering may seem, at times, to be both solitary and unendurable, we can and should have hope and trust that they are neither solitary nor unendurable. Christ is with us in the midst of all of them. Though He DID suffer a solitary passion and death, He did so in order that we might not;

that we might cling to Him and be strengthened by the ministry of the Holy Spirit Whom He sends to us as advocate, comforter and guide, and in His own spiritual presence among us as the body of Christ.

As we face a time of difficult transition, the evils of a world that seems increasingly “off its moorings” and our own daily trials, temptations and difficulties, let us reflect more fully on the deep beauty and love of the Son of Man manifested to His Chosen People in the midst of horrendous injustice that bought, brought and delivered perfect redemption for us.

In our joy, sorrow, gratitude and thanksgiving for this new reality, let us live into the New Life and Light He has delivered and do so with great love and strong purpose.

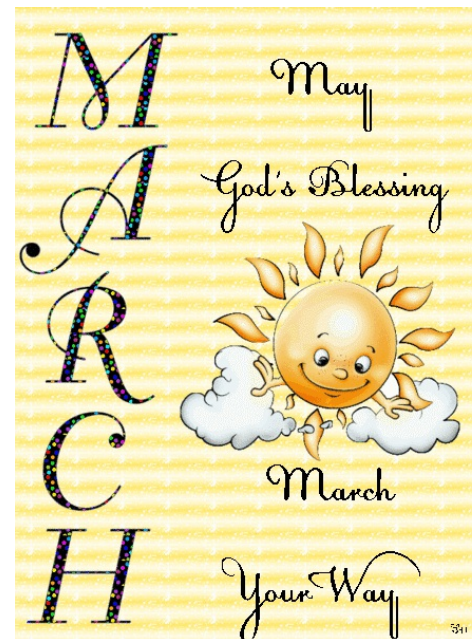
SEASON OF SPRING

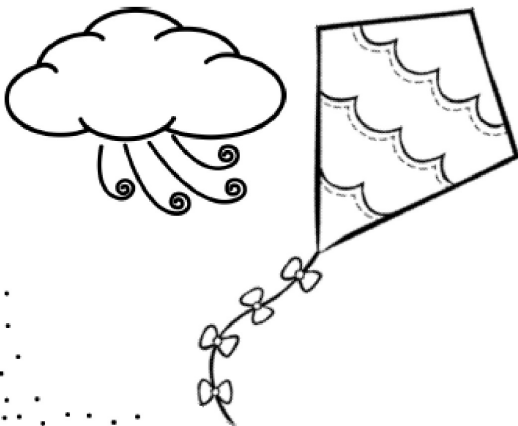
